Volunteers Needed!! Eagle Creek Triathlons August 13 and Go Girls! August 20, 2022



Trip Announcement

Location: East Fork White River

Date: July 23, 2022

Sponsor: Richard Tekulve

Please join us for our annual mid-summer float down one of Indiana's most water reliable streams as we journey down the sandy beached East Fork White River in south central Indiana. Our trip will begin at the Azalia DNR boat ramp located about halfway between Seymour and Columbus. We will travel 12.1 miles to our take-out at the Rockford DNR ramp a few miles north of Seymour. Azalia is located about 55 miles south of downtown Indy via I-65. This should be an easy shuttle of a total of 17 miles. The East Fork generally has a steady 2-2 1/2 m.p.h. summertime current and is overly loaded with numerous, long sandbars making an easy decision for a lunch break exit. The Azalia-Rockford section was last paddled by the HCKC in 2013. The Azalia access is located about 8 miles south of Columbus on CR 800 South between U.S. 31 and S.R. 11. It is located on the SE corner of the bridge over the river (DNR sign and parking lot) and shown on page 51 C-11 in the Delorme Atlas. The stream generally runs a steady 125-200 feet in width throughout most of this section. Over the years we have paddled five different sections of the East Fork ranging from Columbus to Sparksville. Our meeting time will be at 10 am when we will unload boats and prepare for the shuttle to Rockford. Contact me by Friday night (10 pm) to sign up at canoeindiana@yahoo.com or (812) 767-1317. MUSKRAT's Notes on the IPR:

Here is a basic timetable for the IPR, just in case you receive no further information.

The dates for 2022 are Friday, Saturday& Sunday, *August 5-6-7*. Directions to all locations are provided below.

Whenever and Where ever you arrive at the IPR, please proceed directly to the Registration Table.

FRIDAY August 5th:

The first activity of the weekend will be a Trip on Wildcat Creek Friday afternoon; Meeting Time is 3:00-PM at Wildcat Park (Directions Below).

Where we will Paddle will be announced at that time, and the Shuttle will begin immediately thereafter; please arrive early.

There will be a **BYO Campfire Cookout** at **Wildcat Park** following this Cruise. The **IPR Paddler's Campsite** will be available at **Wildcat Park** for both Friday and Saturday nights, thanks to special arrangement with the Tippecanoe County Parks Dept. Camping is strictly "Primitive" with no electricity available. The only utilities are water, pit toilets, and Bathing in the Creek.

2 Lovely Camping Nights At Wildcat Park

SATURDAY August 6th:

Saturday's Creek Trip will begin at Knop Lake Public Fishing Area (Directions Below). This will cover 13.6-miles and end at Wildcat Park. There will be an alternate Takeout for a 9-mile Trip. Lunch at The Gravelbar is BYO.

Shuttle Departure Time is 9:00-AM from Knop Lake PAS. You should plan to arrive at Knop Lake PAS absolutely no later than 8:30-AM (8-AM would be better; it really gets crowded with all the people arriving).

Saturday's Traditional **Chili Supper** will begin serving at 6-PM at the Paddler's Campsite in Wildcat Park (Directions Below).

>>>>> Chili Supper Reservations are the only advance notice you are asked to provide. Simply provide your name and your number of Chili Eaters, so Muskrat can make sure to cook enough for everyone. Please make Chili Reservations at garryhill@aol.com.

The directions below are based on the use of this book. The Gazetteer can be found at Staples, some Meijer's and Wal-Mart stores, bookstores, convenience stores, and others.

Directions To Wildcat Park

Indiana Atlas & Gazetteer Page 31:

Find Monitor on SR-26, east of Lafayette. Go North from Monitor on

CR 775-E. Then, at a "T", turn **Left** on CR 300-N.

Watch for yellow "IPR" marks on the pavement.

Then, **Left** again onto CR 600-E (not written on map).

600-E will drop steeply down into the Valley and make a sharp Right Curve.

The Entrance to Wildcat Park is on the Left, about ½-mile after that Curve.

Watch for the "IPR" signs.

Another option: Take SR-26 West from I-65 (toward Lafayette).

Turn Right at Creasy Lane. Follow this street around a curve,

over the Interstate, and across Wildcat Creek.

At the end of that Bridge, turn **Right** onto Eisenhower Road.

Wildcat Park will be on the Rightâ in about 1-1/2-miles.

Watch for the "IPR" signs.

Directions To Knop Lake Public Access Site

Indiana Atlas & Gazetteer Page 32:

1) From US-31 or SR-931 south of Kokomo, head West on SR-26.

About 4-¼ miles West of Rossville, just after the Town of Edna Mills, turn **Right** onto CR 900-W; <u>watch for a Green Sign to</u> "**Pyrmont**". Go to **NEXT>>>**

2) From I-65 at Lafayette, head East on SR-26. Approximately 7-½ miles East of the Interstate, turn **Left** from SR-26 onto CR 900-W;

watch for Green Sign to "Pyrmont". This is just after the Village of Petit, and 1-mile after the County Line. Go to NEXT>>>

Next>>> In 2-½ miles turn **Right** on CR 650-S (Church on Left).

The Entrance to Knop Lake State Fishing Area is on the **Left** in ½-mile.

Go slow and watch closely; you can easily miss the Entrance Sign, in a wooded area, going downhill.

Watch for yellow "IPR" marks on the pavement, and "IPR" Signs.

For GPS Folks: Carroll County Road 650-S at (about) 720-W.

Follow the gravel road past the Pond (Knop Lake), keeping to the **Left** at every fork, following the IPR-signs, until you reach the Registration Area. Then follow the directions of the Volunteers, and they will get you to the Launch Site as soon as possible.

(On a State Hwy Map, Rossville is located east of Lafayette, south of Delphi, west of Kokomo.)

Trip announcement Location: Patoka Lake Date: Sept. 23-25, 2022 Sponsor: Judy Thompson

Lake Patoka is the second largest lake in Indiana with about 8,800 acres of water and over 160 miles of shoreline. Hoosier National Forest surrounds the lake with rolling tree-covered hills and rock outcroppings. There are headwaters to explore as well as sections where the lake starts feeling like big water.

For Sunday, we have planned a 6-8 mile paddle to an interesting and hard-to-find chain of quarry lakes near the Southeast corner of the lake.

Since it takes over 3 hours to get to Patoka, we will camp overnight at Fisherman's Camp on Friday and Saturday night and paddle both Saturday and Sunday. This campsite is located near a limited speed section of the lake which is more kayak-friendly.

Some of us will drive during the day on Friday and you are welcome to join us for an afternoon or sunset paddle or just to share a campfire with us.

Meeting Place/Saturday Put-In: Fisherman's Camp at Newton-Stewart State Recreation Area --Look for the kayaks! We'll try to get as close to the lake as possible. Newton-Stewart SRA is just north of Wickliffe, Indiana. There is a \$7/car fee (Indiana residents) to enter the SRA. If you have an annual State Property pass, it covers this fee. Directions to Meeting Place: It is about a 3-hour drive from the intersection of I-65 and I-465 on the south side of Indianapolis to Patoka. Drive South on I-65 and get off at Exit 6B (I-265 toward I-64/IN-62/New Albany). Take Exit 0 off of I-265 to merge onto I-64W toward IN-62/St. Louis. Go about 43 miles west on I-64 to Exit 79 and then go 7 miles North on IN-37. Turn slightly left on IN-64 West/IN-145. Follow IN-145 north 3.6 miles until you reach IN-164. Turn left (west) onto IN-164 about 1.3 mile until you see the sign for Newton-Stewart SRA and then turn right (North) into the SRA.

Camping Information: Fisherman's Camp is a primitive campground with water and vault toilets. Each campsite can have 2 tents and cars per campsite so you may be able to share a campsite. There is also a modern campground locat-

Follow the signs in the SRA to the Fisherman's Camp and look for us. Note: This is the fastest route. There is a shorter,

ed elsewhere in the SRA, if you desire a site with electricity and nearby modern restrooms with showers. Campgrounds in general seem to fill up anymore, so you will want to make reservations once you know you want to camp. I may be able to help with site sharing, let me know if you have a site and wish to share.

What to Bring: Bring your camping gear including food (Saturday lunch, Saturday dinner, Sunday breakfast and any snacks you might need) and paddling gear.

I would recommend a 12 ft. or longer boat, but it is not a requirement. You should have some lake paddling experience. Bring a spray skirt if you have one, since there may be some waves when the wind picks up. PFDs must be worn while on the water. The actual route and distance travelled will be dependent upon the capabilities of the paddlers and watercraft attending, as well as weather conditions. We'll be "car camping" so you won't carry your gear in your boat on this trip.

Note: You need a 2022 DNR sticker (\$5) for your boat. They are available at the park gate if you don't have one. Schedule:

Friday Night - We will get in relatively early on Friday. We will have a short sunset paddle around 5:30 if people get in early and are interested.

Saturday 10:00 am - Arrive at Fisherman's Camp.

Sunday - We will paddle approximately 3 hours and then head home. We will break camp and drive to Little Patoka ramp to launch from there.

Trip Announcement

Location: Grayson Lake, Kentucky

Date: Oct. 14-16, 2022 Sponsor: Judy Thompson

Grayson Lake has amazing cliff lined sections, and waterfalls if it rains a day or two before the trip. This trip is a Canoe and Kayak version – we will not be traveling quite as fast as the Sea Kayaking group. I would recommend a 12-foot boat or longer. Saturday's paddle will be about 12-13 miles, with no current to assist. Part of the trip will be where we will be exposed to power boat wakes, and the water can be choppy.

Camping sites go quickly, so if you are interested, please make your reservations as soon as you can. https://www.reserveamerica.com/explore/grayson-lake-state-park/KY/91812/overview. Let me know if you wish to share a site, and I will try to help match up interested persons.

There will be an optional Friday afternoon paddle. The main paddle will be Saturday, with a shorter one on Sunday. We will be camping at Grayson Lake State Park, 314 Grayson Lake Park Rd, Olive Hill, KY 41164, Friday and Saturday nights. We will be "car camping", so feel free to bring as much warm gear as necessary since we will not need to haul camping gear in our boats. Two tents and two vehicles are allowed per site, so sharing sites will cut down on expenses. It is a nice, modern campground with showers and flush toilets. Be sure to make your camping reservations as soon as you can, since it is a popular place on the weekends.

Another Indiana paddling group, IYAK, will be there at the same time. There are plans for an optional combined pitch in dinner with them Saturday night at the campground.

Grayson is about a 4 to 5-hour drive from Indianapolis. It is one my favorite paddling locations, and I feel it is well worth the trip. Please contact Judy Thompson <u>judy thom@hotmail.com</u> for more information.

Friday (Optional) – We will paddle for a few hours and then set up camp.

Launch Time: 1:45 pm Arrive at Ramp

Put-In: Meet at Newfoundland Ramp to launch. Newfoundland Ramp is 17.2 miles south of the interstate exit. Drive down by the water to unload, then you need to drive up and park in the parking lot and walk back down to the ramp. **Mileage:** Negotiable.

Saturday – We will meet at the put-in and paddle about 12 miles up Grayson Lake to Bruin ramp This is an amazing section with cliffs lining most of the 12-mile stretch. There are also many waterfalls (if it rains in the day or two before the trip.

Time: 9:30 am - Boats at Caney Creek Put-In and we'll run our shuttle then. If you're driving down from Indy, you will probably want to drive down Friday night.

Put-In: Rt. 504 turnoff: On Rt. 7 (west side), 17.6 miles south of the interstate exit. When you turn right (West) onto Rt. 504 it, it's another two miles to the ramp.

Take-Out: Bruin boat ramp/beach: On Rt. 7 (east side), 11.9 miles south of the interstate exit.

Mileage: About 12 miles - more or less – depending on how much you explore.

Sunday – We will paddle up Clifty Creek to the Grotto. Usually there will be enough water to enter the Grotto.

Time: 9:30 am

Put-In/Take-Out: The launch ramp is on Rt. 7 about 10 miles south of the interstate on the west side of the road and north side of the creek (if you get to the golf course, you overshot about a mile). This ramp is on the west side of the road and just about 1.3 miles north to the Entrance to the State Park on Rt. 7.

Mileage: 6-10 miles depending on what people are up for.
